



Learn about It

Some nouns are countable (nouns we can count), and some nouns are uncountable (nouns we can't count or not easy to count).

Countable nouns have singular and plural.

Singular	Plural
bank	banks
box	boxes
orange	oranges
story	stories

- ◆ There is a bank near my house.
- ◆ There are two banks near her house.

Special Notes:

We need to put **a**, **an** or **the** before a singular countable noun.

Uncountable nouns are always singular, and we don't need to put a, an, or a number before it.
