

To Parents and Teachers

Read with Phonics is a series of books designed to help students get used to phonics. Using the alphabet as foundation, students progressively learn about short vowels, long vowels, digraphs, etc., making it possible for them to try and sound out words they see. Once the students are familiar with phonics, they will naturally be able to listen and spell, read and sound. This will undoubtedly strengthen their spelling and reading abilities.

The pronunciation of each vowel is recorded. The correct ways to pronounce and read each word is also provided. Teachers can play the CD in class and ask students to listen and repeat. Students can also practice with the CD recording at home. This will help them understand the basic formation of words.

Two sets of words that share the same vowel are given. Paired with colorful and lively illustration, students will be able to understand the meaning of each word easily. Students can trace the letters to enhance memory.





The correct ways to pronounce and read each target word is recorded again to help students remember. Then, the sentence is read out twice to let students hear the words in context. Students can listen and repeat in class and practice again at home.

By using different words to create interesting sentences, we increase the fun in learning. Students can trace the letters, and gradually be able to write short sentences.






