Steps

- 1 Cut two pieces of a straw. Glue them to the bottom of the box. Then cut through the straw pieces.
- 2 Cut off the heads of two cotton swabs. Glue the ends of the swab sticks to the buttons.
- 3 Put the swab sticks into the straw pieces.
- 4 Glue one magnet to the back of the car.
- 5 Glue another magnet to the end of a straw. Make sure the magnets have the same poles on the outside.
